They currently live in a studio apartment and are paying \$750 in rent. Arjeta and her husband Lirdion are a hardworking couple; Arjeta works at McDonalds fulltime, and Lirdion works at Bob's Discount Furniture.

They attended financial counseling at APGFCU; they paid off an old loan and were able to save \$6,500 for the down payment and closing costs. Throughout the under consideration process, they completed 550 sweat equity hours and also continued to volunteer after that.

They are eager to move in to their new home before the new baby arrives!



The Fulton Family Story:

I am a single mother of 3 children with "different abilities" (because I don't like to say special needs). I moved to my current home with no furniture and slept on the floor for a period of time. My oldest daughter is on the Autism spectrum, and living in the apartment is getting harder for her to cope with life's daily stresses. However, we have persevered. Now, six years later, I have furniture, a full-time job, and good health for myself and my children. I have also matured and become very motivated to become educated on what it takes to become a homeowner, from paying



taxes and insurances, to making repairs around the house. I really enjoy going to workshops that deal with home projects.

My journey with Habitat began just over a year ago after a visit to the local Housing agency. I went to submit some changes and the Lead Secretary, after having a conversation with me, encouraged me to apply to Habitat's homeownership program. I was not approved at first because I had some credit challenges to overcome. But I worked with APGFCU for the next 10 months and after some hard work, I was able to get recommended by APGFCU to get presented to Habitat for review.

When I received the call that my family and I were approved to receive a home, I was completely OVERJOYED! I believe that God had connected me with Habitat to help me realize my dream of owning a home. Habitat has helped equip me with new skills (sweat equity), and taking classes to help me to be smart about money and to help me take care of my home throughout the years to come. I have to do all that I can for my children, and even though we have had many hardships, I feel that my family has grown. My family and I are extremely grateful for this opportunity. 

My dad got injured at work from a piece of heavy equipment falling on his hand, which required surgery. The doctor told him to go on disability because he couldn't move his hand after the surgery. We had to move into another house that we could afford with my dad's disability and my income. We thought that this house was a good fit for us until the landlord started increasing the rent until we couldn't afford it anymore. There were plumbing and electrical issues with this



house; I was fixing what I could with my own money because our landlord would not fix the house.

I tried to get loans to find a better home for my family, but I had not had any success yet. After my sister told me about Habitat, I was so excited. This could be my last hope and chance to have a home for my family. I attended an orientation session to find out more information about Habitat. Rolanda and the other two ladies were very professional and helpful answering all of the questions that I had. After that, my family knew Habitat was perfect for us.
