HABITAT AMERICORPS construction crew leader



Are you interested in learning the construction trade? Habitat Susquehanna is looking for two individuals to be Construction Crew Leaders on its build sites. Individuals will be working alongside construction supervisors and learning the trade. No experience is required, just a willingness to learn. By the end of the 10-month service year, the Construction Crew Leaders will be able to lead volunteer groups at the build sites. Service year starts in August.

repair coordinator

Habitat for Humanity Susquehanna does not just build homes, but also does critical home repairs. Many low-income individuals and families own their homes but over time their homes develop issues that can affect the family's health and livelihood. That is where Habitat Susquehanna's Repair Program comes in. Our goal is to help low-income homeowners live independently and keep them safe in their homes. Our Repair Program does repairs for 30-50 households in a given year. Currently, our Repair team is made up of two staff members. In order to expand our services and outreach, we are looking for an AmeriCorps member to be part of the team. This is a 10-month long program. Individuals will be working alongside our Repair Manager learning the ins and outs of Habitat Susquehanna's Repair Program. In order to become an expert on identifying critical home repairs, the AmeriCorps member will accompany the Repair Manager on house visits and assist on our build sites once a week learning the construction trade. By the end of the year, the member will be updating our Repair Program. The service for this position starts in September.
