OVERVIEW

The Repair Program Field Coordinator oversees critical home repairs for low-income homeowners. The Repair Program Field Coordinator will assist with home inspections, work scope creation, and execution of work. The Repair Program Field Coordinator works with the Repair Program Manager to facilitate and oversee the activities of subcontractors and skilled laborers including plumbers, electricians, HVAC, and other licensed trades professionals, as well as local officials and inspectors if necessary.

IDEAL CANDIDATE'S KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS:

- Must have a high school diploma or its equivalent (college degree preferred)
- A minimum of three years of hands-on, residential construction and supervision required, with experience with home rehabilitation and renovation preferred
- Experience working in construction for a non-profit is a plus
- Knowledge of standard building codes, local government jurisdiction policies and procedures, and history of conducting and passing inspections
- Thorough knowledge of general home repairs, trades, energy efficiency, and accessibility modifications for the disabled

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Oversee on-site construction through the completion of each assigned project including rehabilitation, repair, aging-in-place, and weatherization
 - Plan and coordinate residential repair activities by performing home assessments, prioritizing repair needs, completing agreements, and following up with homeowners to ensure satisfaction
 - Contribute to the selection of subcontractors, development of scopes of work, and creation of construction schedules
 - Maintain accurate records and invoices
 - Ensure program compliance with regulations of each funding source with Repair Program

- Participate in community engagement activities: neighborhood clean-ups, educational outreach, community fairs, etc.
- Assist in developing relationships with community organizations and associations, churches, government, seniors, veterans, businesses, hospitals, and other non-profits
- Attend and participate in staff meetings and other organizational events

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Excellent communication and people skills
- Able to work with diverse clients while showing respect, kindness, and empathy
- Able to effectively collaborate as part of a team
