#### Did you know?

September 1995: First Harford Habitat for Humanity home was built. It was a threebedroom rancher on land donated by the City of Aberdeen. (This was before we merged in 2011 with Habitat for Humanity of Cecil County to become Habitat for Humanity Susquehanna.)

September 2008: Launch of Habitat for Humanity Susquehanna's Repair Program (which at that time was called the Fix-It Up program).

September 2011: Dedication of first house completed under the newly-merge Habitat for Humanity Susquehanna. The house on Cherry Lane, Elkton, was built by the students from the Cecil County School of Technology.
