Looking for Women Build teams and lunch donors

We are currently looking for Women Build teams to form, fundraise and volunteer for our upcoming house build on Clinton Street, Elkton, which is a duplex. The friendly yet competitive peer-to-peer fundraising campaign will run from April 30 to June 28, coinciding with the time teams will be volunteering to help build the homes.

Last year, 14 Women Build teams worked together to turn a grassy area into a Habitat house in Aberdeen. The teams for this year's Women Build will also be starting the house build from the ground up, but this time, in support of two Habitat families.



In 2024, we had teams from

Mountain Christian Church, Trinity Lutheran (top and middle photos), and Word of Faith who participated in this event. We are hoping that their past participation inspires and encourages our faith groups to join in and help us this year. Sign-up is through our <u>website</u>.

We also need lunch donors to help feed our Women Build teams. Our build dates will be April 30 through June 29, all falling on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays, except for the one Wednesday that is on April 30. We are planning for about 20 days with the Women Build teams, and need lunch for approximately 18 people for each of those build days. In the past, our volunteers have enjoyed wraps, sandwiches, fried chicken, pasta salads, boxed lunches, pizza, and more. 
We thank all of our donors. You have our deepest gratitude for your generosity!
